The Arctic Ungulate Conference (AUC) is a chain of conferences arranged under the name of reindeer/caribou symposia from 1972 to 1988, and under its present name from the 1991-conference in Nuuk, Greenland.

The conferences have been hosted by Finland, Alaska, Norway, Canada, Sweden and for the first time the AUC took place in the Russian Federation in 2007. Venue was in the Sakha Republic (Yakutia) at the Yakutsk State University after Ammosov. About 80 persons attended and lectures were given in ungulate morphology, taxonomy, ecology, diseases, and also economic management, legal and socio-economic issues were covered.

The Arctic Ungulate Society (AUS) in cooperation with NOR has applied for financing a proceedings of the conference.

The AUS has asked Canada to arrange the 13th AUC in 2011.
